
Sherlock Holmes and a Christmas Mystery Visual Story



When you walk in, you will see the set for the show. It looks like a dirty Victorian street, with a desk, some chairs and a writers bureau.



You will see three performers on the stage in the show. Their names are Gerard, Charlotte and Katriona.





Katriona will be onstage as you enter the performance, when the show starts you will hear a voiceover.	
Sherlock is trying to solve the mystery of a lost hat. Watson interrupts them.	
Together Sherlock and Watson attempt to solve the mystery. When they are thinking deeply, the stage lights up blue.	

Sherlock and Watson work out what type of person they think owns the hat. Suddenly Sherlock remembers that they are supposed to be eating a goose!

Sherlock brings the goose out from the kitchen and begins to carve.

Sherlock finds hidden inside the goose a Blue Carbuncle, a beautiful blue diamond.





Watson recognises it as a jewel that was stolen recently. We see lots of recent newspaper clippings and reports.	
James Ryder of the hotel gives a statement.	
Sherlock and Watson decide to trace Henry Baker, the owner of the hat.	

Sherlock tells us the story of the jewel.	
Henry Baker arrives and confirms that the hat is his. However, it is proven he played no knowing part in the crime.	
Sherlock and Watson head to the Alpha Inn, the place where Henry Baker bought the goose.	
The Landlord at the pub tells Sherlock he bought the geese from Breckinridge of Covent Garden.	
Sherlock and Watson chat for a while.	

Sherlock upsets Watson by making some harsh statements.	
They travel together to Covent Garden Market.	
Sherlock and Watson overhear Breckinridge arguing with someone.	
Sherlock interrupts Breckinridge to try and find out where they bought the geese from.	

Breckinridge becomes angry, but Sherlock tricks them into making a bet.	
Breckinridge tells Sherlock that they bought the geese from Mrs Oakshott at Brixton Road.	
Sherlock and Watson head to Brixton Road.	
Sherlock and Watson break into Oakshott Fowlers.	
They find feathers and pipe ash, which they believe might be clues to the person who stole the gem.	

They map out their journey to try to find more clues.	
Sherlock suddenly finds a notebook, linking the Hotel Cosmopolitan to the Oakshott Fowlers.	<image/>

Watson invites Sherlock to go to their house for Christmas Lunch.	
Watson leaves Sherlock on their own.	
Sherlock looks at the jewel one last time.	
The lights will go dark.	
When the lights come back up, the actors will be onstage to take their bows.
